THE VINES RESORT

NESTLED in the picturesque and tranquil Swan Valley wine region, The Vines Resort offers two challenging 18-hole courses that are playable for golfers of all abilities.

Designed by Graham Marsh and Ross Watson, the two 18-hole layouts at the Vines are uniquely different.

The Ellenbrook Course stretches to 6541m from the tips, and offers a stern test of golf. Played from the men's blue tees the course stretches to 6207m and 5381m from the ladies tees. The Lakes course, by contrast is 6497m from the blue tees and for the women 5097m.

There are also gentler visitors' tees and tougher professional tees on both courses. The bent grass greens on both courses are among the largest in the country and the unique bunkering is eye-catching.

If you haven't been there in a few years, then you'll be happily surprised with a return visit. The resort has benefited greatly

from a multi-million-dollar refurbishment project over the past few years, which saw upgrades to the accommodation, restaurants, conference facilities, lobby and more. There is also a state-of-the-art mini golf course, which is fun and challenging for kids and adults alike, as well as the award-winning Keishi Day Spa, Stretch Specialist and Aura hair salon in the resort grounds.

The comfortable clubhouse offers a bar and restaurant, locker rooms and shower facilities. There's even a vineyard within the 103 room resort, which makes the venue the ideal place to stay-and-play.

If you're interested in playing the courses regularly, as a member, The Vines features a modern and progressive credit-based golf membership system starting from just \$1390 per year.

In essence, members earn or purchase a set number of credits which can be redeemed on a pay-as-you-play basis for a round of golf (at various rates, depending on time/day).

It is designed to allow greater flexibility for players to suit their current lifestyle, commitments and financial ability. All memberships include use of the Lakes and Ellenbrook golf courses, fully-equipped gymnasium, four tennis courts (two floodlit), one squash court, members swimming pool and BBQ area, access to members change rooms and lockers, access to the members' bar, discounts across the resort including dining, day spa, golf shop and accommodation.

If you do have a good round going, don't lose concentration on the 401m par-4 18th. It can be a card destroyer.

Busselton Golf Club operates a well-equipped golf shop where you can buy from a well-stocked range of golf equipment, accessories and clothing.

The club's practice facilities include a 250m driving range, chipping and pitching green and a large putting green. Practice balls are available for use and motorised golf carts, clubs and buggies are available for hire.

The course welcomes visitors. It costs \$50 to play 18 holes and \$30 to play nine holes. Unlimited walking golf after 3pm is \$20.

The clubhouse is inviting, comfortable and a nice place to check your scorecard over a drink and a bite to eat. Stay-and-play deals are available.

For interstate travellers, Jetstar flies direct to Busselton Margaret River Airport on Mondays, Wednesday and Saturdays, which is ideal for golfing trips.

Kalgoorlie Golf Course

KALGOORLIE GOLF COURSE

WHEN you book your golf trip to Perth, make sure you factor in Kalgoorlie Golf Course because the sublime Graham-Marsh-designed layout is one you'll definitely want to tick off your bucket list.

The first thing you notice about this layout of wild beauty is the magnificent colours – red, green and blue.

The red dirt butts up against the green manicured fairways with the blue sky as the backdrop.

Variety and fine conditioning define this work of art.

From the tee boxes, the course looks intimidating but it has numerous tee positions and is considerably more forgiving than many others you'll play in your travels.

From the tips, the course stretches to 6768m, but off the shorter public tees it's 835 metres shorter.

Former club professional Paul Breuker said Kalgoorlie prided itself on its greens, which clock in at between 9 and 11 on the Stimpmeter.

"Graham Marsh has designed big, flowing greens which allow five or six pin positions."

Many greens are tiered with the par-5 18th a lengthy, three-tier rollercoaster.

An approach shot here could be anything from a wedge to a seven-iron depending on the pin position.

"If there's one shot you need around here' it's a good short game," Breuker said.

"A lot of greens are elevated so you are playing a lot of uphill chip shots, but that is becoming easier now due to the fairways maturing and the greens starting to soften after five years of maturity.

"It's a typical Marsh design in that if you hit the ball long the fairways narrow, but the average distance off the tee has generous landing areas," Breuker said.

The 202m par-3 8th from the tiger tees is challenging and a definite feature hole. From the members' tees it's 178m, the public tees 165m and the ladies tees 118m.

"When you stand on the tee it's a very elevated green with a drop off to the right side," Breuker explained. "It's long and visually pleasing."

Visitors are always welcome and can walk (\$70) or ride. Cart hire is \$43.50 for 18 holes.

The club's restaurant and bar is open for business from Wednesdays to Sundays.

"We recommend everyone should play this golf course," Breuker said.

Inside Golf did and thoroughly enjoyed the experience.

Here's how to enjoy Mandurah's magical waterways and nature:

1. Make a splash in Mandurah's magnificent new estuary pool. Named Kwillena (dolphin) Gabi (waters) by the traditional owners of Bindjareb Boodja, this natural waterway shares its habitat with local marine life.

2. Join a dolphin, sunset, Murray River lunch cruise or indulge in a wild seafood experience.

3. Or hire a private charter or join a guided eco sailing yak tour and have a more personalised experiences as you cruise the waterways.

4. Be your own captain and hire a boat to explore the estuary, the canals and beyond at your own pace (no skipper's ticket required).

5. You can even cook a barbecue on the water with an electric round boat that you can hire at Mandurah's Ocean Marina.

6. Glide through the water via pedal power with water bikes.

7. Explore the wonders of nature on guided nature tours from the bushland to the waterways.

8. If you like things a bit faster, enjoy the thrills of riding a jet ski.

9. Go scooping in shallow waters for Mandurah's famous blue swimmer crabs (1 Dec – 31 July).

To completely unwind, hire a fully equipped houseboat and enjoy waterways for days.

Bunbury Golf Club

BUNBURY GOLF CLUB

DRIVE the dual-lane Forrest Highway for 90 minutes from Perth and you'll be right at Bunbury Golf Club and glad you made the trip.

The course was established on the site in 1948 and the vision of the members over 70 years ago has resulted in an exceptional course with a challenging but forgiving layout. Strategically placed bunkers make you consider your shots carefully.

Although the course is tight, but not too tight, there are areas in which you can play safe. Standing on the 124m downhill par-3 10th hole you get to take in the magnificent views of the Leschenault Estuary and

Bunbury prior to teeing off. Avoiding the bunkers and determining the wind factor makes this feature hole a test of your golfing prowess.

The home of the premier golf event in the South West, the 54-hole annual Sw Isuzu South West Open is held each June long weekend. Many high-profile professionals have visited over the years, including Brett Rumford, Peter Lonard and Minjee Lee. Minjee Lee is a two-time winner of the Bunbury Bowl – an annual two-day event for women golfers – prior to turning pro.

The course is easy to walk although carts are available to hire. Green fee players are welcome and the club offers a Monday

special of just \$25 for 18 holes. Other days the cost is \$47. Visiting groups are offered special rates. The golf shop also offers hire clubs plus a great range of apparel and golfing equipment. The club also offers an online booking system for visitors so you can plan your games ahead.

There is a 280m driving range, putting green and a chipping and bunker practice area all of which are open to the public seven days a week.

The clubhouse boasts a full bar, lounge and dining facilities for up to 200 people. It provides an excellent setting for a variety of functions. A number of weddings have been held at the club and the background views are spectacular, especially at sunset.

Membership continues to grow and this growth attributes a lot to the magnificent condition of the course. The greenkeeping staff takes enormous pride in their work and this is reflected in the presentation of the course.

A range of membership options are available to suit all golfers, including country memberships. Do yourself a favour and book a round today!

"In April 2019, we staged our most successful 'Chasing the Sun tournament' in 10 years.

"We had a record field of 71 at Ceduna Golf Club to take on this challenge of a great Australian journey across the Nullarbor.

"They loved every moment of the tournament and finally arriving at Kalgoorlie Boulder to complete the best-ever 'Chasing the Sun Golf Tournament'.

West Australia sports author John Terrell summed up the 2019 tournament perfectly: "I have just finished one of the most incredible experiences of my life.
